INTERNATIONAL PARTNERS OF THE WEEK

Victor and Nosizo Nakah serve with Mission to the World, the international sending agency of the Presbyterian Church in America, which is committed to church planting—the establishment, growth, and maturity of the church. Victor is an ordained Presbyterian minister who has served in various capacities on the African continent in the church and in organizations that include the International Fellowship of Evangelical Students and CURE International. As MTW International Director of Sub-Saharan Africa, Victor's primary role is to oversee the development of church planting and church renewal in the region—partnering with missionaries who serve alongside local believers in major cities. He also supervises master's and PhD students attending South Africa Theological Seminary and teaches at the Africa Reformation Theological Seminary in Uganda. Besides supporting the work of her husband, Nosizo enjoys her ministry of encouragement to church planters' wives. Victor is currently working with the Sub Saharan Africa Reformed Mission Board—leading strategic planning meetings for its work with ministries led and served by indigenous workers that are particularly connected to church planting. We ask your prayers for Victor and Nosizo as they serve Sub Saharan Africa and for God's wisdom and guidance for the plans and decisions made at this time by the SSARM Board.
